Resolution

WHEREAS, the Travis County Commissioners Court understands the need for affordable, safe and decent housing for the County's most vulnerable residents and fiercely supports the end to homelessness;

WHEREAS, the Travis County Commissioners Court acknowledges and supports the Austin City Council's March 2010 resolution to develop a comprehensive strategy that would prioritize the City's affordable housing resources - including federal and local monies - for the construction and operation of 350 permanent supportive housing (PSH) units;


WHEREAS, the Ending Community Homelessness Coalition (ECHO) is coordinating the 100 Homes Campaign as Austin/Travis County's contribution to the 100,000 Homes Campaign, a national three-year program whose goal is to house 100,000 vulnerable, homeless individuals and families by 2013;

WHEREAS, as part of the 100 Homes Campaign initiative, ECHO is coordinating Austin/Travis County Registry Week, November 7 - 9, when more than 150 volunteers will identify and survey Austin's most vulnerable homeless individuals and families in order to create a by-name registry that will prioritize those homeless individuals who are the most medically vulnerable and then move them into permanent supportive housing by November 2013; and

WHEREAS, the 100 Homes Campaign engages policymakers and the community in support of Permanent Supportive Housing consistent with the commitment to effect 350 units of such Housing in the Austin area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT WE, THE TRAVIS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT DOES HEREBY SUPPORT THE ENDING COMMUNITY HOMELESSNESS COALITION'S 100 HOMES CAMPAIGN TO ENSURE THE SUCCESSFUL EXECUTION OF THE REGISTRY, HOUSING AND COMMUNITY AWARENESS GOALS OF THE 100 HOMES CAMPAIGN.




